## **STUDENT TEST COMPROMISE POLICY**

### **INSTRUCTIONS.**

*Sheppard AFB (SAFB) Form 302, Test Compromise - Student, will be signed by all students enrolled in formally measured courses in the 882 TRG. The form will be signed on the first day of the course after students are briefed on the policy regarding cheating and test compromise. The signed SAFB Form 302 will be retained by course personnel until the students are graduated or are eliminated from training. Follow-on courses will re-accomplish SAFB Form 302 on the first training day. 882 TRG personnel encourage the transfer of knowledge through specialized individual assistance, directed study, test critiques, group study sessions, etc.; but cheating and test compromise are prohibited and will not be tolerated.*

### **TEST COMPROMISE:**

*1. Definition - Cheating or test compromise is the unauthorized discussion, disclosure or possession of test materials or responses. Specific examples include, but are not limited to:*

- a. Unauthorized discussion of specific test questions or responses prior to, during or after an examination.*
  - b. Attempts by a student to gain access to specific test responses from another examinee.*
  - c. Unauthorized removal or attempted removal of test material by a student from the testing environment.*
  - d. Theft or other unauthorized possession of test material by an individual.*
  - e. Any action which is intended or designed to discover one or more test answers through means other than legitimate study or preparation for the purpose of gaining unfair advantage, i.e., looking at another student's answer sheet during test administration in order to discover the answer(s) to one or more test questions.*
- 2. Penalty - Persons subject to the Uniform Code of Military Justice (UCMJ) who fail to comply with this policy will be subject to prosecution under the UCMJ and appropriate administrative actions. Civil Service employees who fail to comply will be subject to disciplinary actions under the provisions of AFI 36-704, Discipline and Adverse Actions.*
